




MOA/SUA Real Time!

Define the Business of Insurance

Broker vs. Carrier

- · Insurance Broker *Represents the consumer* in the search for insurance needs.
- · Insurance Carrier / Provider *Financial resource* behind the coverage provided in the policy.

Lots of Brokers – Not many Providers in the Aviation Market

Number of providers has shrunk in recent years



Premiums

- How much you pay for the policy
- Insurance premiums did hit a low in recent years
- Currently in a "market correction"
- "Large Loss" events Tornados (3 w/in 6 months), Other Natural Disasters, airline major loss

Boeing 737 MAX and other large losses have put providers with limited cash on hand – premium hikes are making up for that



Age Restrictions?

Yes – 70 years old and type of aircraft being covered

Stats show most frequent payouts occur with pilots in the 50-60-year-old range





- GA Transient Ramp An apron where itinerant general aviation operators can park their aircraft without FBO services and subject to terms and conditions.
- FBO Ramp Ramp controlled by a commercial FBO entity OR sponsor if municipal run FBO (inherent associated fees)
- GA Tenant Parking Parking area for based aircraft (subject to leased tie down or hangars)










Sobering Statistics


