USACE commented on January 26, 2021 that numerous wetlands and tributaries are located within the review area identified in your letter and you state that you anticipate that the project will impact wetland resources. Because we may have jurisdiction by law, we agree to participate as a cooperating agency for the preparation of the EA in accordance with the Regulations Implementing the Procedural Provisions of the National Environmental Policy Act. FAA commented on May 12, 2021 with No objection provided the Federal Aviation Administration is notified of construction or alterations as required by Federal Aviation Regulations, Part 77 Objects Affecting Navigable Airspace. WAPA commented on May 19, 2021, WAPA transmission line will be greatly impacted by South Veterans Parkway project. Similar to SD 100 project, WAPA involvement is paramount.	An adaptive management plan will be developed which will outline FHWA and WAPA responsibilities for NEPA and Section 106 consultation that is required because of WAPA undertakings that are forced due to South Veterans Parkway. Further coordination with WAPA will occur as design progresses to better understand WAPA undertakings that are being forced by the South Veterans Parkway project.

SDGFP commented on May 25, 2021, there is no anticipated significant impact to fish and wildlife resources and would anticipate that to remain if the provided suggestions are considered during the planning and construction of the project (including, #5. complete visual surveys for lined snakes prior to work in lined snake habitat between April-October and #6. backfilling any trenches).	The study area appears to only have limited and marginal suitable habitat for the lined snake. A map of the project area was provided to SDGPF to review that labeled the location of a potential lined snake habitat patch based on proximity to its known source population along the Big Sioux corridor. Clarification on the scope of implementing the lined snake was sought with the intent of implementing SDGFP's recommendations to the area most likely to provide lined snake habitat. On August 2, 2021, the SDGFP concurred with the approach to implement the lined snake recommendations (visual surveys prior to initiating construction and prior to backfilling trenches during construction) only in the area identified as suitable habitat. SDDOT will include an environmental commitment to conduct visual surveys for the lined snake prior to initiating construction and prior to backfilling trenches between April 1 and November 1, when the lined snake is active. If snake species is observed during construction, construction would halt until a SDDOT wildlife biologist or other biologist who has obtained an Endangered Species Permit through the Game, Fish and Parks arrives to properly identify and then
	remove and relocate the lined snake.

The South Dakota Department of Transportation (SDDOT) and Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) completed an Environmental Assessment (EA) and a Finding of Significant Impact (FONSI) was signed in 2012 for the above referenced projects, which are also locally known as the South Veterans Parkway Project. A map detailing the location of the project is attached. The project will comply with all federal and state environmental regulations.

The project includes a proposed six-lane, limited access highway to be constructed from just east of the Interstate 29 (Exit 73) / Lincoln County Road 106 (CR106) interchange to just north of the South Dakota Highway 11 (SD11) / 57th Street intersection. It would tie into the already constructed Veterans Parkway segments between 57th Street and Interstate 90. The purpose of the project, as defined in the EA, is to prepare the City of Sioux Falls for the future 2035 transportation system by addressing street discontinuity, street design deficiencies, capacity limitations, safety and access associated with growth in the area.

Since the FONSI was signed in 2012, there have been changes related to urban growth in the study area and changes in the regulations. At this time, an evaluation is being undertaken to determine if additional analysis for any resources is necessary.



The South Dakota Department of Agriculture and Natural Resources (DANR) has reviewed the above-referenced project for potential impacts to natural resources. Based on the information submitted in your letter dated May 10, 2021, DANR has the following comments, concerns about environmental impacts, and permitting requirements.

Tanks and Spills

The Inspection, Compliance, and Remediation Program (ICRP) maintains a database of petroleum and chemical releases as well as regulated storage tanks within South Dakota. Our records show several spills and one storage tank near your project area. We have compiled this information in the attached table. In the event that contamination is caused by or encountered during the construction activity, The Department of Transportation must report the contamination to DANR at 605-773-3296. Contaminated soil that is excavated during construction should be segregated from clean soil, stockpiled, and sampled to determine disposal requirements. Please be aware that if piping or other equipment will be installed in a location where it may come into contact with contaminated soil or ground water, it should be evaluated to ensure it is compatible with the contaminant. 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

On behalf of FHWA and SDDOT, we are re-engaging you on South Veterans Parkway due to changes that have been made in the project's scope. Nine intersecting City arterial projects are now being included in the South Veterans Parkway Supplemental Environmental Assessment. The Study Area now extends to the next major intersections associated with the nine additional arterial projects. These rational endpoints were used to complete a traffic analysis for the project in order to establish the 23 CFR 771.111(f) requirements for the South Veterans Parkway corridor in addition to the nine intersecting City arterial projects. Attached is the updated Study Area which include the following additions from the previous Study Area:

- Exit 73 interchange
- corridors for each of the nine intersecting arterials up to the next major intersection,
- areas where borrow / stormwater detention have been or are currently being seriously considered,
- a corridor paralleling the WAPA transmission line
- areas to accommodate constructing new points of access to private land / structures







The Department of Game, Fish and Parks has reviewed the above projects involving the proposed construction of South Veterans Parkway in Sioux Falls, South Dakota.

We have conducted a search of the SD Natural Heritage Database for the above referenced project. This database monitors species at risk, specifically those species that are legally designated as threatened, endangered or rare. We did not find any occurrences of endangered, threatened or rare species in the immediate project area. Please note many places in South Dakota have not been surveyed for rare or protected species and the absence of a species from the database does not preclude its presence from your project area.

However, we found records of lined snake (Tropidoclonion lineatum), a state endangered species near the project vicinity (North side of Sioux Falls, near the Cactus Flats area). Lined snakes inhabit dry grassland areas and are most often observed by searching under objects they are sheltering under, such as rocks and logs. Lined snakes are typically active during April-October. You can find more information on lined snake biology and habitat needs here:

https://www.sdherps.org/species/tropidoclonion lineatum.

Based on the information provided, there is no anticipated significant impact to fish and wildlife resources and would anticipate that to remain if the following suggestions are considered during the planning and construction of the project.

- 1. Disturbance to riparian and wetland areas should be kept to an absolute minimum.
- 2. If riparian vegetation is lost it should be quantified and replaced on site. Seeding of indigenous species should be accomplished immediately after construction to reduce sediment and erosion.
- 3. A site-specific sediment and erosion control plan should be part of the project.
- 4. A post construction erosion control plan should be implemented in order to provide interim control prior to re-establishing permanent vegetative cover on the disturbed site.











- 5. Complete visual surveys for lined snakes prior to work in lined snake habitat (e.g. dry grassland areas) from April-October.
- 6. If the project requires trenching for installation of infrastructure, we recommend backfilling the trench at the end of each workday (April-October), so snakes cannot fall into open trenches and to be trapped and buried under fill. If trenches cannot be filled prior to the end of the workday, we further recommend covering open trenches and inspecting open trenches left overnight for endangered snake species prior to backfilling.

Good afternoon Hilary -

I am reaching out regarding the agency comments and recommendations for South Veterans Parkway dated May 25, 2021. We have reviewed the study area and coordinated with SDDOT regarding the lined snake recommendations (#5/#6).

In your letter, you had noted that lined snakes inhabitat "dry grassland areas" and seek shelter under rocks and logs similar to what is present near Cactus Flats. The habitat within the South Veterans Parkway study area is patchy and isolated from the larger, more contiguous grassland areas along the Big Sioux River. Many of the locations are along road ROW, wetland edge and previously disturbed area associated with the continuing urbanization.

Given the size of the study area, limited suitable habitat and areas of marginal habitat, we would like to focus the recommendations where possible and beneficial. We generally get better compliance from contractors and it is easier to enforce when it's not a blanket commitment across the project but recommendations are targeted. Thus, we request that you review the attached KMZ with Eileen and identify suitable habitat. If suitable habitat patches are identified, include a short habitat suitability note to compare against our preliminary suitable habitat determinations.

In addition to getting agreement on areas for implementing recommendations, we are seeking additional clarification/discussions on expectations related to these recommendations.

- What is the extent of the visual survey required? Is it as simple as having biologist conduct a visual survey by flipping over logs, rocks, or other ground debris prior to disturbance at that location(s)?
- Will we need to conduct a full scientific survey within the identified habitat with documentation such as what was done at Cactus Hills?
- If a lined snake is found, can it be relocated, or will we have to wait on site for Eileen?

If it is easier to discuss over the phone or short virtual meeting, please let me know and I can get that set up.

Thank you for your review and additional coordination related to the lined snake.



I am responding to your email of 16 August 2021 regarding your request for a state threatened and endangered species permit. Your request described your interest in being covered for the capture and relocation of up to 50 lined snakes (*Tropidoclonion lineatum*) during certain construction activities on the Veterans Parkway from Sycamore Avenue to 57th Street in Sioux Falls, South Dakota.

With this letter of authorization, you and the DOT project manager may survey the work areas prior to ground disturbance for lined snakes and relocate live snakes to a grassland/woodland area away from the project.

Annual reports are due to me on December 31 of each permitted year for activities covered under this authorization. The following information should be reported by year:

- results of surveys conducted prior to construction activities
- total number of lined snakes relocated each year

Project Type Recommendations

Due to the potential occurrence of federal threatened Northern Long-eared Bats (Myotis septentrionalis) a survey should be conducted at bridge locations to confirm presence/absence of bats. If bats or bat activity is observed, please coordinate further with Game, Fish and Parks. Construction activities should be avoided during the maternity roosting period, generally June 1 to July 31.

Revegetation

- Disturbance to native vegetation should be kept to a minimum.
- Any disturbed area should be revegetated using native seed sources.

Legal Obligations

South Dakota Endangered and Threatened Species Law

This state law (Chapter 34A-8) defines nongame, threatened and endangered species and wildlife and describes the relevant authorities of the Game, Fish and Parks Secretary and Commission. The SDGFP Commission may list, delist or change the status of state threatened or endangered species. The Secretary shall conduct investigations to address information needs on population, distribution, habitat needs, limiting factors and other data gaps to ensure these species are managed in perpetuity. Take of state threatened or endangered species is prohibited except for certain, authorized purposes or to protect life or property. This state law also prohibits the reintroduction of a species on the federal list of threatened or endangered species that is considered extirpated from the state, unless authorized by the South Dakota Legislature. Aquatic Invasive Species

South Dakota Administrative Rule 41:10:04:02 forbids the possession and transport of aquatic invasive species (AIS). Any construction vehicles, vessels, or equipment that will come into contact with surface waters in South Dakota that have previously been used outside of the state or in and AIS positive water within South Dakota must be thoroughly power washed with hot water (>140°F) and completely dried for a minimum of 7 days prior to use. All attached dirt, mud debris and vegetation must be removed and all compartments and tanks capable of holding standing water shall be drained and dry. This applies, but is not limited to, all equipment, pumps, lines, hoses and holding tanks. The list of AIS positive waters is available

Bald and Golden Eagle Protection Act

The Bald and Golden Eagle Protection Act (16 U.S.C. 668–668d) provides for the protection of the bald eagle (*Haliaeetus leucocephalus*) and golden eagle (*Aquila chrysaetos*). Under this federal act, "take of eagles, their parts, nests or eggs is prohibited unless a permit is issued for certain purposes and under certain circumstances as long as the authorized take is compatible with the preservation of eagles. Disturbance resulting in injury, decreased productivity, or nest abandonment by substantially interfering with normal breeding, feeding or sheltering behavior is also considered take. This report does not replace consultation with the USFWS regarding the protection of bald and golden eagles. Eagle nests are protected under this law, whether active or inactive.

Migratory Bird Treaty Act

The Migratory Bird Treaty Act (16 U.S. C. 703-712) provides international protection to migratory bird species included in treaties among the United States, Great Britain, Mexico and Japan. This

federal act prohibits the taking, killing, possession and transportation (among other actions) of migratory birds, their eggs, parts, and nests, unless specifically permitted by regulations. This act has no provisions for allowing unauthorized take. Effective steps can be taken to avoid take of migratory birds. Work closely with the USFWS to identify protective measures to avoid migratory bird take. A list of migratory bird species protected under this act can be found at 50 CFR 10.13. Introduced bird species are not protected under this Act. This report does not replace consultation with the USFWS regarding the protection of migratory bird species.

Endangered Species Act

The Endangered Species Act (16 U.S.C. 1531–1544) provides protections for native plant and animal species that are in danger of becoming extinct. Under Section 9, it is unlawful for the "take" of a listed species. This is defined as "... to harass, harm, pursue, hunt, shoot, wound, kill, trap, capture, or collect or attempt to engage in any such conduct". However, a permit may be issued for take that is the result of an otherwise legal activity. Please contact the USFWS to determine if a permit is needed.

The USFWS is in charge of the protection of listed species and their critical habitat. Similarly, other federal agencies are also directed to conserve listed species and ensure their actions do not jeopardize a listed species existence or destroy or adversely modify critical habitat. As such, under Section 7, federal agencies should consult with the USFWS to ensure compliance with this Act. This report does not replace consultation with the USFWS regarding listed species.

Clean Water Act

The intent of the Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C. 1251 et seq.) is "to restore and maintain the chemical, physical, and biological integrity of the Nation's waters". SDGFP has concerns for any impacts to wetlands, streams and riparian habitats from development. We recommend that proper planning take place to first and foremost avoid impacts to wetlands, streams, and associated riparian corridors. If dredge or fill materials will be placed into waterways or wetlands, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Regulatory Office should be contacted to determine if a 404 permit is needed.

Fish and Wildlife Coordination Act

The Fish and Wildlife Coordination Act (15 U.S.C. 661-667e) provides habitat protection by requiring a federal agency to consult with the USFWS and SDGFP (i.e. the state fish and wildlife agency) whenever an agency is proposing to control or modify a stream or other body of water. The intent of this consultation is to conserve wildlife resources by preventing habitat loss or damage. If control or modification of a water body is proposed, please begin consultation with the USFWS and SDGFP.



South Veterans Parkway Topo Basemap with Land Ownership, Tribal Lands, and Locator Map





Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the above-referenced project pursuant to 54 U.S.C. 306108 (Section 106) of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966 (as amended). The Office of the South Dakota State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO) concurs with your determination regarding the effect of the proposed undertaking on the non-renewable cultural resources of South Dakota.

On September 23rd, 2021, we received your letter and enclosures pertaining to the proposed Roadway Construction for PCN 01V9, PCN 01V6, PCN 01V7, and PCN 01VA in Minnehaha and Lincoln Counties. Included in the enclosures was the report titled "A Level III Cultural Resources Survey of the Previously Unsurveyed Portions of South Veteran Parkway Project Areas in Lincoln and Minnehaha County, South Dakota" by Troy Kogel of Kogel Consulting Services, and "Architectural Resources Investigation for South Veterans Parkway Project South Veterans Parkway" by HDR inc. Mr. Kogel's report identified two previously recorded archaeological sites: a portion of the Chicago, Milwaukee, and St. Paul (CMSP) Railroad (39LN2007) and a portion of the Chicago, Rock island Railroad (39LN2016) are within in the project area, which has been determined eligible for the National Register of Historic Places. Previous SHPO Concurrence determined these portions of the sites 39LN2007 and 39LN2016 were non-contributing elements. (SHPO ID: 071009009F) Based upon the information provided, the KSOO Radio Transmission tower (SHPO ID: LN00000746) should be considered "Eligible" for listing on the National

Register of Historic Places. Therefore, SHPO concurs with your determination of "No Adverse Effect" for the proposed undertaking.

Project activities occurring in any areas not identified in your original request, will require the submission of additional documentation as described in 36 C.F.R. § 800.4.

Concurrence of the SHPO does not relieve the federal agency official from consulting with other appropriate parties, as described in 36 C.F.R. § 800.2(c).

If historic properties are discovered or unanticipated effects on historic properties are found after the agency official has completed the process outlined by 54 U.S.C. 306108 (Section 106) of the National Historic Preservation Act, the agency official shall avoid, minimize, or mitigate the adverse effects to such properties and notify the SHPO and Indian tribes that might attach religious and cultural significance to the affected property within 48 hours of the discovery, pursuant to 36 C.F.R. § 800.13.

Attached for your review are two cultural resources survey reports: *Architectural Resources Investigation for South Veterans Parkway Project, Sioux Falls, South Dakota* by HDR Engineering and *A Level III Cultural Resources Survey of Previously Unsurveyed Portions of South Veterans Parkway Project Areas in Lincoln and Minnehaha County, South Dakota* by Kogel Archeological Consulting Services. The architectural resources report covers structures that were not previously old enough for evaluation during the 2003 and 2012 environmental assessments (EAs) completed for the project, while the archeological resources report covers minimal areas not previously surveyed due to minor design modifications. SHPO previously concurred with the *No Adverse Effect* and *No Effect to Historic Properties* findings associated with the EAs on 5/6/2010, 5/10/2010, 9/8/2011, and 9/15/2011.

A supplemental EA is being prepared address changes that have occurred since 2012, as such these additional cultural resource investigations were undertaken to supplement previous work. The architectural investigation identified 10 historic-age (built in or prior to 1976) above-ground resources in the Project APE in the 2021 survey. Two resources were previously identified (39LN2007 and 39LN2016) so the report addressed the 8 newly surveyed/evaluated properties. One newly recorded property, the KSOO radio transmission site at 26962 476th Avenue, is recommended eligible for the NRHP for state-level significance under Criterion A (LN00000746). The property is adjacent to the proposed roadway, but no contributing features of the property are located within the limits of disturbance. The proposed limits of disturbance lie approximately 600 feet north of the transmission building and approximately 100 feet north of the nearest (northernmost) radio tower. A non-historic concrete foundation for the northwest radio tower guy wire is within the Veterans Parkway construction limits. During the final design phase of the project, options will be reviewed to minimize or avoid impacts to the modern guy wire and foundation. SDDOT concurs that LN00000746 is eligible for NRHP listing and requests SHPO concurrence in this eligibility assessment.

The archaeological survey examined total of 19 discrete locations encompassing a total of approximately 9.6 acres within the APE. No archaeological sites were identified as a result of this work. Based on the previous ground disturbances noted across the survey area, numerous previous cultural resources surveys, coupled with the small area of the project areas, the potential for buried historic properties within the project area is considered low.

As a result of ongoing cultural resource investigations three historic properties have been identified within the Project APE: 39LN2007, 39LN2016, and LN00000746. Eligibility and project effect associated with sites 39LN2007 and 39LN2016 was coordinated with your office in 2011. The supplemental cultural resource survey identified one additional historic property, LN00000746, the KSOO radio transmission site at 26962 476th Avenue. As currently designed, the Project will have no impact to any features or structures associated with the historic components or character-defining elements of the communications property, including the original radio towers or the transmission building. Given this, the SDDOT recommends and requests SHPO concurrence that the project will continue to have *No Adverse Effect* on historic properties, as previously determined in 2010 and 2011.

In 2011, SDDOT consulted with your office regarding the *de minimis* finding for the NRHP-eligible sites 39LN2016 and 39LN2007. There are no changes to the eligibility for either of these sites and we have determined that a *de minimis* finding is still appropriate. If your office concurs with the eligibility assessment outlined here for LN00000746, FHWA intends to make a *de minimis* impact determination in accordance with the 23 CFR 774.5.

Should any evidence of buried cultural resources be encountered during the project construction activities, such activities will cease and the SHPO in Pierre or the ARC in Rapid City will be notified immediately in order to determine an appropriate course of action.

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the above-referenced project pursuant to 54 U.S.C. 306108 (Section 106) of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966 (as amended). The Office of the South Dakota State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO) concurs with your determination regarding the effect of the proposed undertaking on the non-renewable cultural resources of South Dakota.

On September 1st, 2022, we received your updated letter and enclosures pertaining to the proposed Roadway Construction for PCN 01V9, PCN 01V6, PCN 01V7, and PCN 01VA in Minnehaha and Lincoln Counties. Included in the enclosures was the report titled "A Level III Cultural Resources Survey of the Proposed Sioux Falls Intersection Project Areas in Lincoln and Minnehaha Counties, South Dakota", "A Level III Cultural Resources Survey of the Proposed Minnesota Avenue Soil Borrow Area Associated With the Construction of South Veterans Parkway in Sioux Falls, Lincoln County, South Dakota", "A Level III Cultural Resources Survey of the Proposed Western Avenue Soil Borrow Area Associated With the Construction of South Veterans Parkway in Sioux Falls, Lincoln County, South Dakota", and "A Level III Cultural Resources Survey of the Proposed Cliff Avenue Stormwater Detention Pond in Sioux Falls, Lincoln County, South Dakota" all by Troy Kogel of Kogel Consulting Services. Mr. Kogel's reports identified two new archaeological sites: a farmstead (39LN0103) and the eight foundations associated with the Griswold Farm District (39LN0137) within the expanded study area as well as previously recorded sites 39LN2016 and

39LN0136 which were revisited during the survey. The purpose of this letter was to give an updated plan for the proposed undertaking, share additional information regarding the sites that were found, and to request concurrence with our updated project effect determination. Regarding the coordination of site eligibility recommendations, SHPO concurs that 39LN103 and 39LN0136 remain Unevaluated for National Register of Historic Places (NRHP) listing, 39LN0137 should be considered Not Eligible for listing on the NRHP, and that the portion of 39LN2016 should be considered non-contributing to the overall eligibility of the site. Therefore, SHPO still concurs with your determination of "No Adverse Effect" for the proposed undertaking.

Project activities occurring in any areas not identified in your original request, will require the submission of additional documentation as described in 36 C.F.R. § 800.4.

Concurrence of the SHPO does not relieve the federal agency official from consulting with other appropriate parties, as described in 36 C.F.R. § 800.2(c).

If historic properties are discovered or unanticipated effects on historic properties are found after the agency official has completed the process outlined by 54 U.S.C. 306108 (Section 106) of the National Historic Preservation Act, the agency official shall avoid, minimize, or mitigate the adverse effects to such properties and notify the SHPO and Indian tribes that might attach religious and cultural significance to the affected property within 48 hours of the discovery, pursuant to 36 C.F.R. § 800.13.

We are reaching out to provide an update on the South Veterans Parkway project, share additional information regarding sites that have been found, and to request concurrence with our updated project effect determination.




Figure 1. Study Area for South Veterans Parkway, associated nine intersecting City arterials, and current borrow/stormwater detention areas.

On October 4, 2021, your office concurred with a "No Adverse Effect" for the proposed South Veterans Parkway project (letter attached). Since that time, a change in scope has occurred to the project where the nine intersecting City arterial roadways are now being included within the Supplemental Environmental Assessment. These intersecting arterial projects were previously being planned by the City; however, federal funds have been made available for them which was a determining factor in including them within the Supplemental Environmental Assessment for South Veterans Parkway. The Study Area now extends to the next major intersections associated with the nine additional City arterial projects that intersect the proposed South Veterans Parkway (Figure 1). These rational endpoints were used to complete a traffic analysis for the project in order to establish the 23 CFR 771.111(f) requirements for the South Veterans Parkway corridor in addition to the nine intersecting City arterial projects. Attached is the updated Study Area which include the following additions from the previous Study Area:

- Exit 73 interchange
- corridors for each of the nine intersecting arterials up to the next major intersection,
- areas where borrow / stormwater detention have been or are currently being seriously considered,
- a corridor paralleling the WAPA transmission line
- areas to accommodate constructing new points of access to private land / structures




Figure 2. Growth area map depicting the South Veterans Parkway corridor and extent of the nine City arterial improvement projects that intersect South Veterans Parkway.

Although the Study Area has been extended to the next major intersection along each of the intersecting arterial projects, improvements to the arterials will be limited to what is required in order to meet the operational needs of future projected traffic within the Study Area as shown in Figure 2.¹

A Level III cultural resource survey examined the City arterial projects that intersect South Veterans Parkway during the Summer/Fall of 2021 and Spring of 2022. This survey was conducted by Kogel Archaeological Consulting Services and resulted in a report entitled *A Level III Cultural Resources Survey of the Proposed Sioux Falls Intersection Project Areas in Lincoln and Minnehaha Counties, South Dakota* (see attached report). No shovel testing was conducted due to the previous ground surface disturbances, the numerous, previously conducted cultural resources surveys, and the upland setting of the proposed project area. This report identified sites 39LN0103 and 39LN0137 and previously recorded sites 39LN2016 and 39LN136 were revisited during the survey.

Level III cultural resource surveys also took place in three separate areas that were identified as potential borrow areas for the project and would be maintained as stormwater detention facilities once the project is constructed. These surveys were also conducted by Kogel Archaeological Consulting Services and resulted in three reports entitled A Level III Cultural Resources Survey of the Proposed Minnesota Avenue Soil Borrow Area Associated With the Construction of South Veterans Parkway in Sioux Falls, Lincoln County, South Dakota; A Level III Cultural Resources Survey of the Proposed Western Avenue Soil Borrow Area Associated With the Construction of South Veterans Parkway in Sioux Falls Lincoln County, South Dakota; and A Level III Cultural Resources Survey of the Proposed Cliff Avenue Stormwater Detention Pond in Sioux Falls, Lincoln County, South Dakota (see attached reports). These potential borrow locations abut South Veterans Parkway and are located to the west of Western Avenue, west of Minnesota Avenue, and east of Cliff Avenue. No newly or previously recorded cultural resources were identified in these three locations.

As a result of the Study Area extension outlined above and the resulting additional cultural resource survey work, SDDOT would like to coordinate the following site eligibility recommendations:

- Site 39LN0103 is a farmstead located near the Sycamore Avenue/69th Street intersection and **SDDOT** recommends it should remain unevaluated for NRHP listing. There is a granary (Structure LN00000724) within the boundary of site that was previously recommended not eligible. The South Veterans Parkway project will avoid this site; however, future improvements along the City arterials may impact the site at a later time when intersection of 69th and Sycamore is improved (currently not planned). Further site evaluation would be conducted as part of that future improvement project and coordinated with your office.
- Site 39LN0136 consists of a native American artifact scatter and SDDOT recommends it should remain unevaluated for NRHP listing. The site is located southeast of the proposed South Veterans Parkway/57th Street intersection which is proposed for construction in 2026, outside the scope of the current South Veterans Parkway. The South Veterans Parkway project will avoid this site; however, further site evaluation may need to be conducted as part of the future improvement project and coordinated with your office.
- Site 39LN0137 is associated with the former Griswold Farm District (SHPO Structures LN01700001–LN01700008) and is located within the NE1/4 and theSE1/4 of Section 18, T100N, R49W. According to records search results, the standing structures were evaluated in August of 1991 and determined not eligible for the NRHP under Criteria A–D. All above-ground elements have since been demolished. The site boundary was determined by the distribution of foundations and fence lines associated with the former the Griswold Farm. A large depression north of the gravel approach is the former location of Structure LN01700001, the domestic residence. The current survey indicated that when this structure was torn down, the below ground foundation was removed as well. Based on the noted ground disturbance from the removal of the structures at the site and the previous not eligible determinations associated with the former above-ground elements, SDDOT recommends site 39LN0137 as not eligible for NRHP listing.
- Site 39LN2016 consists of the Chicago, Rock Island & Pacific Railroad which crosses the 69th Street City arterial project, which has been determined to be eligible for NRHP by your office. The segment of the

site does not have any contributing features and has been reclaimed, it does not retain any characteristics that would contribute to its status as a NRHP-eligible property and thus the SDDOT recommends the portion of site 39LN2016 within the Study Area is recommended to be a non-contributing element.

In sum, project activities associated with South Veterans Parkway will avoid sites 39LN0103 and 39LN0136, and, if warranted, site evaluation would be conducted and coordinated as part of future improvement projects. SDDOT recommends site 39LN0137 as not eligible for NRHP listing. The portion of site 39LN2016 with the Study Area is a non-contributing element to the overall site. With the additional of the nine City arterial roadways associated with South Veterans Parkway including the three potential borrow site locations, **SDDOT recommends continued concurrence with the Section 106 determination of "No Adverse Effect" for the proposed undertaking**. SDDOT seeks your concurrence in these site eligibility and project effect recommendations.





The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), in cooperation with the South Dakota Department of Transportation and City of Sioux Falls is continuing work on the remaining segments of the connector between I-90 and I-29. FHWA is the federal lead agency in fulfilling the requirements set forth in the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and Section 106 of the National Historical Preservation Act for the South Veterans Parkway (the Project). The proposed six-lane, limited access highway would be constructed from just east of the Interstate 29 (Exit 73) / Lincoln County Road 106 (CR106) interchange to just north of the South Dakota Highway 11 (SD11) / 57th Street intersection. It would tie into the already constructed Veterans Parkway segments as shown in the attached map. An Environmental Assessment (EA) was completed and a Finding of Significant Impact (FONSI) signed in 2012 for the South Veterans segment. The purpose of the project, as defined in the EA, is to prepare the City of Sioux Falls for the future 2035 transportation system by addressing street discontinuity, street design deficiencies, capacity limitations, safety and access associated with growth in the area.

We have determined that a supplemental EA needs to be completed and we invite the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, SD Regulatory Office to be a cooperating agency as there will be impacts to wetlands and streams, some of which we expect to be determined to be Waters of the United States under the jurisdiction of your agency. We anticipate completing this EA within one year, the established time limit under the CEQ's Final Rule "Update to the Regulations Implementing the Procedural Provisions of the National Environmental Policy Act".

Per the CEQ regulation, a cooperating agency is an agency with jurisdiction by law or special expertise with respect to any environmental impact (40 CFR 1508.1). In accordance with 40 CFR 1501.8, your agency's role in this project would be to 1) Participate in the NEPA process at the earliest possible time, 2) Participate in the scoping process, 3) Developing information and prepare environmental analysis concerning areas of your expertise or jurisdiction when requested by the lead agency, 4) Make available staff support at the lead agency's request to enhance the latter's interdisciplinary capability, and (5) Normally use its own funds, (6) Consult with the lead agency in developing the schedule and elevate any issues relating to purpose and need, alternatives or other issues that may affect your agencies ability to meet the schedule, (7) Meet the lead agency's

schedule for providing comments and limit comments to matters your agency has jurisdiction by law or special expertise, and (8) To the maximum extent practicable, jointly issue environmental documents with the lead agency.

Efficient Environmental Reviews for Project Decision Making (23 U.S.C §139) outlines additional considerations for the Lead and Cooperating Agencies when a transportation agency is the lead federal agency. Specifically, 23 U.S.C. 139(d)(8) mandates that to the maximum extent practicable and consistent with Federal law, all Federal permits and reviews for a project rely on a single environmental document prepared under NEPA, under the leadership of the lead agency. To the maximum extent practicable, the lead agency must develop an environmental document sufficient to satisfy the requirements for any Federal approval, action, or permit required for the project. In doing so, FHWA can make certain that the EA would meet your needs for adoption and application to your permitting decisions.

Please respond to FHWA with an acceptance or denial of the invitation no later than January 22, 2021. If your agency declines, the response should state your reason for declining the invitation as pursuant to 23 U.S.C 139.

We look forward to working with your agency on the South Veterans Parkway Project. If you have any questions or would like to discuss the project in more detail or our agencies' respective roles and responsibilities during this project, please contact me at 605.776.1012. The project efforts are expected to begin early 2021, so we appreciate your timely response.





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

Thank you for your time meeting yesterday for those that could make it. This is an invitation touch base again next week as we discussed in order to better understand how WAPA would like to approach NEPA and NHPA responsibilities with FHWA as the lead federal agency of this undertaking.

Attached are the minutes of yesterday's meeting which includes a list of "Next Steps". Please correct me if I misunderstood items that were discussed or left out key discussion items.

Currently we have addressed utility / WAPA considerations in the Supplemental EA early in a summary table outlining the resources that require further review and is as shown in the clip below.

Since there have been no environmental resources of significant concern identified in the vicinity of the WAPA line crossing through previous environmental / cultural studies in the general area (Veterans Parkway EAs and City Regional Stormwater BMP, etc), it appears there is very little risk for environmental constraints of utility modifications and this will just come down to a discussion of costs. Understanding there will still be procedural items that need to be completed for NEPA and NHPA, I believe those items can be addressed in a later re-evaluations as more information on design becomes available. Ideally, we will document in the agency correspondence section an understanding of an adaptive management process for how NEPA and NHPA related to WAPA will be handled in later re-evaluations.

1) Summary of previous coordination

WAPA was not previously coordinated in previous 2012 Supplemental EA for southern portion of SD100 (now South Veterans Parkway).

WAPA had indicated based on early scoping letter that South Veterans Parkway would impact a transmission line.

Utility coordination for South Veterans Parkway is being conducted chronologically and has not occurred for the final segment where the WAPA crossing occurs.

This meeting is to continue the conversation to understand how/if to address WAPA environmental needs in the Supplemental EA or later re-evaluations and how FHWA and WAPA would like to coordinate efforts.

4) WAPA level of NEPA expectations

WAPA has a Categorical Exclusion that allows for structure locations as long as its within ROW. Categorical Exclusions can be used for relocations outside ROW so long as area is previously disturbed and under a certain distance (10 miles?)

WAPA would have to see plans to make any judgement as to what the domino effect might be on WAPA structures.

Christina inquired as to whether the Supplemental EA would outline an adaptive management process to describe the process for how to evaluate impacts as design progresses. She also asked whether a re-evaluation would be completed as more information is known since typically WAPA can't make concrete decisions on what's needed until design is provided.

Tom agreed that this would be a good approach.

Kendall indicated that this meeting and future coordination will assist in understanding what the adaptive management plan would look like and that the Supplemental EA will commit to future coordination to develop a process. Kendall said that EA re-evaluations will likely be needed as borrow material is identified as well as other items that arise during final design, similar to how the Northern Veterans Parkway project. Those re-evaluations could include additional environmental clearances that are required for WAPA undertakings that are being forced due to South Veterans Parkway.

5) FHWA & WAPA NEPA coordination


Tom inquired as to whether whoever is the NEPA lead would also be the 106 consultation lead.

Thank you for your time meeting yesterday for those that could make it. This is an invitation touch base again next week as we discussed in order to better understand how WAPA would like to approach NEPA and NHPA responsibilities with FHWA as the lead federal agency of this undertaking.

Attached are the minutes of yesterday's meeting which includes a list of "Next Steps". Please correct me if I misunderstood items that were discussed or left out key discussion items.

Currently we have addressed utility / WAPA considerations in the Supplemental EA early in a summary table outlining the resources that require further review and is as shown in the clip below.

Since there have been no environmental resources of significant concern identified in the vicinity of the WAPA line crossing through previous environmental / cultural studies in the general area (Veterans Parkway EAs and City Regional Stormwater BMP, etc), it appears there is very little risk for environmental constraints of utility modifications and this will just come down to a discussion of costs. Understanding there will still be procedural items that need to be completed for NEPA and NHPA, I believe those items can be addressed in a later re-evaluations as more information on design becomes available. Ideally, we will document in the agency correspondence section an understanding of an adaptive management process for how NEPA and NHPA related to WAPA will be handled in later re-evaluations.

Just one clarification in the meeting notes, regarding the discussion on an CX-level review (first paragraph under item #4). Although WAPA has a CX-category for structure relocations, we must also consider the requirements for segmentation (do not improperly segment larger actions into smaller actions in an effort to meet a CX-level determination rather than an EA or EIS) and properly analyze connected actions. Since WAPA's structure relocations would not occur "but for" FHWA's proposed project, it seems unlikely that a CX could be used.

Christina,

I appreciate your response with the clarification and will attach this clarification to the meeting notes. I sensed the direction we were heading towards after the meeting last week was to acknowledge any structure relocations (should it need to occur) is part of the FHWA South Veterans Parkway undertaking and as such, the environmental effects would be analyzed as part of a FHWA EA re-evaluation as more information is known with WAPA being a participating agency. This clarification only makes doing so a stronger case vs having WAPA conduct a separate EA or an unsuccessful attempt in trying to make it fit under a CX.

Tomorrow we should be able to agree to a general plan of action, including how FHWA and WAPA would like to proceed in formalizing a plan to move forward and close that unknown within the Supplemental EA. The early response we received from Cody Kinsley indicated that WAPA would be substantially impacted. My suspicion is that he was speaking from an operations standpoint as opposed to a NEPA standpoint. As a participating agency in NEPA and NHPA, I suspect WAPAs primarily role at this point would be to identify as early as practicable issues concerning the projects potential environmental or socioeconomic impacts that could result in delaying an FHWA decision on re-issuing the FONSI or issuing a new FONSI.

I am aware that WAPA would need to review the South Veterans Parkway design prior to providing any clear and definitive input. At the same time, as I indicate below, to me it appears there is very little risk for environmental constraints of utility modifications as informed by previous studies in the area and if tower relocations are needed, it will likely come down to a discussion of costs.

No problem. I'll be sending out another opportunity to re-convene next Wednesday. In the meantime, 1st attached is the recently completed 106 consultation for the South Veterans Corridor. Most of the corridor had been cleared in the past, although there were a number of locations that weren't surveyed or we couldn't previously access. As it might pertain to your interest, page 8 of the attached report (2nd attachment) shows that the WAPA corridor (presumably ROW) has previously been surveyed, and everything to the north of the South Veterans Parkway study area for a healthy distance has been previously surveyed. I suspect with a little bit of research, you may be able to determine the likelihood of any additional 106 consultation needs should there be any tower relocations within or even within proximity to the current ROW. The 3rd attachment is a graphic from an earlier EA that was completed noting the cultural survey results, including historic structures and archeological sites that are within the study area. Let me know if you would benefit from having additional survey reports – the full 106 consultation dating back to the early 2000's has truly been a maize.

Good Morning, Kendall.

I have conducted a search of WAPA's records for cultural resource data associated with our Sioux Falls to Beresford T-line right-of-way (ROW), specifically structures 7/6 through 8/1 which could be potentially impacted by the construction of the South Veterans Parkway. Based on our GIS records, as well as the documents that you provided in previous emails (particularly the 2021 Kogel repot), it appears as if all of our ROW associated with the proposed SVP has been previously surveyed by non-WAPA archaeologists.

However, if WAPA structures and ROW must be relocated (which appears to be the case) to an unsurveyed area due to the project's parameters, these locations must be surveyed, the subsequent report reviewed by WAPA, and concurred with by SHPO, prior to any structure relocation.

Thanks for your diligence in consulting with WAPA regarding the SVP project. If there are any changes to the project in the future that may affect our transmission line, please let me know.





The South Dakota Department of Transportation (SDDOT) and (Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) completed an Environmental Assessment (EA) and a Finding of Significant Impact (FONSI) was signed in 2012 for the above reference projects, which are also locally known as the South Veterans Parkway Project. A map detailing the location of the project is attached. The project will comply with all federal and state environmental regulations.

The project includes a proposed six-lane, limited access highway to be constructed from just east of the Interstate 29 (Exit 73) / Lincoln County Road 106 (CR106) interchange to just north of the South Dakota Highway 11 (SD11) / 57th Street intersection. It would tie into the already constructed Veterans Parkway segments between 57th Street and Interstate 90. 

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (Service) received on July 15, 2021 your effects determination for the 'South Veterans Parkway Project' (the Action) using the northern long-eared bat (*Myotis septentrionalis*) key within the Information for Planning and Consultation (IPaC) system. This IPaC key assists users in determining whether a Federal action is consistent with the activities analyzed in the Service's January 5, 2016, Programmatic Biological Opinion (PBO). The PBO addresses activities excepted from "take" prohibitions applicable to the northern long-eared bat under the Endangered Species Act of 1973 (ESA) (87 Stat.884, as amended; 16 U.S.C. 1531 et seq.).

Based upon your IPaC submission, the Action is consistent with activities analyzed in the PBO. The Action may affect the northern long-eared bat; however, any take that may occur as a result of the Action is not prohibited under the ESA Section 4(d) rule adopted for this species at 50 CFR §17.40(o). Unless the Service advises you within 30 days of the date of this letter that your IPaC-assisted determination was incorrect, this letter verifies that the PBO satisfies and concludes your responsibilities for this Action under ESA Section 7(a)(2) with respect to the northern long-eared bat.

Please report to our office any changes to the information about the Action that you submitted in IPaC, the results of any bat surveys conducted in the Action area, and any dead, injured, or sick northern long-eared bats that are found during Action implementation. If the Action is not completed within one year of the date of this letter, you must update and resubmit the information required in the IPaC key.

This IPaC-assisted determination allows you to rely on the PBO for compliance with ESA Section 7(a)(2) <u>only</u> for the northern long-eared bat. It **does not** apply to the following ESA-protected species that also may occur in the Action area:

Thank you for your letter received October 19, 2021, requesting environmental comments regarding the above referenced project involving a proposed six-lane, limited access highway to be constructed from just east of the Interstate 29 (Exit 73) / Lincoln County Road 106 (CR106) interchange to just north of the South Dakota Highway 11 (SD11) / 57th Street intersection. It would tie into the already constructed Veterans Parkway segments between 57th Street and Interstate 90. This project is located in Minnehaha County, South Dakota.

According to the National Wetlands Inventory, (available online at www.fws.gov/wetlands/) wetlands exist within the project boundary. If a project may impact wetlands or other important fish and wildlife habitats, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (Service), in accordance with the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (42 U.S.C. 4321-4347) and other environmental laws and rules, recommends complete avoidance of these areas, if possible, then minimization of any adverse impacts, and finally replacement of any lost acres, in that order. - areas to accommodate constructing new points of access to private land / structures






