Employee Engagement in Action

Annual employee meetings were held across the state once again this past fall and early winter. These meetings provide an excellent opportunity for leadership to engage with staff in person to hear what is most important.

Staff input given at the employee meetings held in 2024 directly led to several changes and actions including: development of an annual statewide construction map, defining the role of the lead highway maintenance worker, creating a plow cutting edge work group, updating the clothing allowance policy, issuing a guidance memo on remote work, and additional training on Open Roads.

While these initiatives have addressed some of the suggested improvements, we appreciate that staff shared additional thoughts and ideas at the recent 2025 employee meetings. Areas that were discussed and identified to review for improvement in 2026 included: weekend, holiday and emergency call-in pay, concerns with IT implementation (BISON, Evergreen, E-Construction and MEMS), contractor accountability and work quality, loss of knowledge as employees retire, use of Teams phones, post construction improvement opportunities, material testing and inspection demands, communication on funding impacts, and an overall interest in AI.

In addition, the Executive Team has completed an initial review and identified specific items for action. This working list of **2026 actionable items** may also be found on the Intranet at <https://intranetdot.sd.gov/docs/empl/Actionable%20Items%20from%202025%20Employee%20Meetings%20-%20Jan%202026.pdf>.

One of the first actions being addressed is a review of policies **DOT-S-PER-3 Field Activity Overtime / Flex Guidelines and DOT-S-PER-9.2 Overtime Policy**. A guidance document that will combine these two policies is being drafted and will be sent out to the policy review team. The guidelines will address concerns we heard from employees that are working weekends and holidays, scheduled for construction activities or when responding to emergency needs.

We continue to find tremendous value in the annual employee meetings overall. The breakout sessions provided a wonderful opportunity to discuss topics of interest or concern in a smaller group setting. Thank you for your engagement. We will continue to work side-by-side with employees to make SDDOT an even stronger organization.

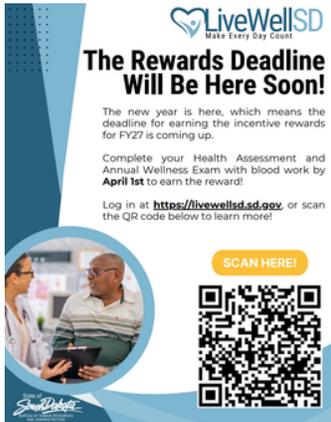

Please know that I am excited to work with SDDOT staff throughout the state to closely align all safety-related goals with the SDDOT 2026 Strategic Plan. Thank you for working with our team, which includes **Carol Evans, Region Safety Coordinator** - located in Pierre and **Steve Schneider, Region Safety Coordinator** - located in Sioux Falls to move the department's safety initiatives forward.

A high-level summary of our short and long-term goals includes:

- Build a **Value Based Safety process - Zero Incident Mindset**
- Update the **SDDOT Employee Safety Manual**
- Streamline our Region Safety Committees
- Increase the **visibility** of the Safety Team in the field
- Create a **Safety Management Database** to improve field safety communications with emphasis on improved accident investigations
- Improved **Safety Orientations** for Supervisors and Employees
- Provide ongoing **safety-based communication** through the monthly newsletter, meetings, etc.

A **Value Based Safety process** will help us adopt proven practices. While it will take time to implement, this process will help us reduce safety and claims losses, and move us toward being a leader in safety standards for the State of South Dakota. This process helps us move away from a traditional philosophy of reactive safety management where the primary strategy is measuring statistics and benchmarking goals from the statistics.

A Zero Incident Mindset will help the SDDOT proactively define and implement measures and solutions to put safety at the forefront of all decision-making with the ultimate goal of meeting the objective of everyone home safely every day!

- **Restrictions:** Some profile picture changes may be restricted by your IT administrator.



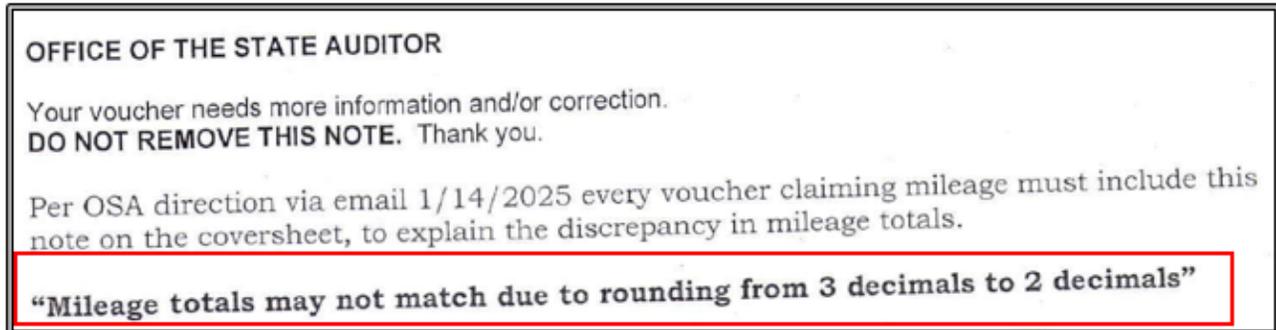
Finance Corner

Employee Travel Reimbursements (Mileage)

When processing employee travel with mileage, there may be an issue with rounding in Batch Load.

You should notate **"MILEAGE TOTALS MAY NOT MATCH DUE TO ROUNDING FROM 3 DECIMALS TO 2 DECIMALS"** on the voucher cover sheet. This will ensure it has been reviewed by the administrative staff who processed the voucher, the employee & the approver (supervisor).

This tip demonstrates how to **Create a Desktop Icon** for Primavera Cloud.

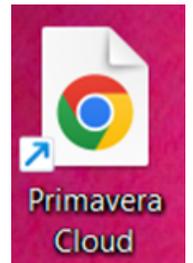
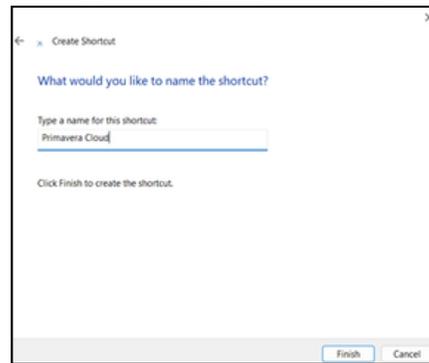
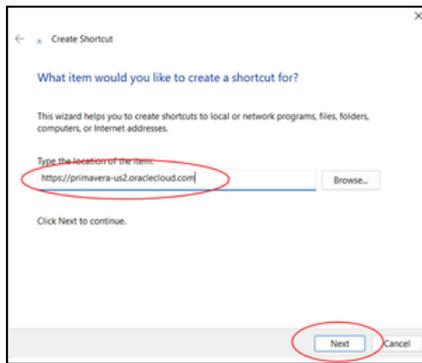
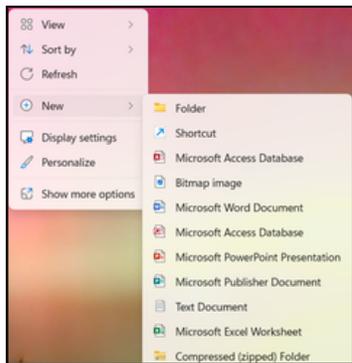
1. On your **Desktop, Right Click**, select **New** and then select **Shortcut**.
