We cannot make changes to the following:

- Invoice Number
- Invoice Date

The voucher will need to be deleted and re-entered with an "X" behind the invoice number.




In the end, we raised \$1,235 cash plus change that was presented on Dec. 8, 2023. Way to go Central Office!




