


Primavera Tips/ Tricks


SDDOT utilizes Primavera P6 scheduling software for the design phase of a project. Additionally, Primavera software is utilized for various aspects of project management to help with managing resource workloads (current & future) and to assist in the delivery of projects in a timely matter. Through the SDDOT "Connecting the DOTs" newsletter, the Project Delivery Team will begin providing periodic tips to help staff utilize the Primavera software.

This tip demonstrates how to **Search (or Find)** information within the software.

1. On the **Projects** tab, select the column you want to search, in this example "Project ID" is used.



2. Type **Control + F** on the keyboard or use the menu at the top of the screen and Select "Edit", then Select "Find". I sile Edit View Project Enterpris




The following pop-up will appear:

- a. Type in the Project ID (Project Control Number PCN) you are searching for and
- b. Select "Find Next" or Select "Enter" on the keyboard.



3. The software will navigate to the PCN you searched for and highlight the project.



The search function works on other tabs as well, such as in the <u>Activity</u> tab if you want to search for example, an Activity ID ("3055") or Activity Name ("Gradeline").

Finance Corner

PROCEDURE ... Here are the two most common errors for your errors for vouchers needing to be reset at the 1 p.m. or 4 p.m. run!

1. A remit message cannot contain special characters.

This error means that special characters are being added in the remit message that are not allowed. BFM allows the following characters in the Description and Remit Message fields:

- √ 0-9
- √ A-Z, a-z
- √ Space
- ✓ Pound sign (#)
- √ Ampersand (&)
- √ Dash (-)
- ✓ Period (.)
- √ Comma (,)
- √ Slash (/)
- √ Dollar sign (\$

- ✓ Parentheses ()

2. No active vendor found.

This error means the vendor is not found in the vendor list. The vendor may be inactive, no longer in the system, or may need a group number. Make sure your vendor number was entered correctly and obtain a new W9 if it was.

November Mentoring MinuteWhat's Your Favorite "Failure"?

The August 2023 issue of <u>The Mentoring Messenger</u> was titled **"Finding My Favorite Failure."** This topic inspired us to reflect upon our careers – one who is midway through, and one who is only weeks away from retirement.

We all know that failures can hurt, be embarrassing, and cause problems. But what we don't always consider (or remember) when they occur, is that failures are better viewed as lessons learned. We often focus on getting beyond the failure and forgetting that it happened so we can forget the pain, embarrassment, or problems.

One of the most effective ways we learn is through failure. Even as parents, sometimes the best way for us to teach our children is to allow them to fail. Of course, this is in somewhat of a controlled environment. Perhaps the most iconic example is learning to ride a bicycle. Everyone fails, but eventually learns from those failures and it becomes second nature.

The South Dakota Department of Transportation recognizes that failures will occur. Often times, the failures are addressed as learning experiences and discussed in anonymous group settings. In addition, the Mentoring Program offers an avenue to travel through other's "failures" without the embarrassment, grief, or issues. Mentors and mentees both can learn from each other – and better yet, situational mentors can provide lessons they've learned, all in a controlled, educational setting.

When I reflect on my failures during my time with the Department, I always revert to a simple ADA ramp that I provided direction to build a certain way. Although relatively minor in the grand scheme of things, this ADA ramp catches runoff water from the road and ponds where pedestrians travel. Everything is compliant with the ramp, but I failed to ensure drainage was maintained. The point is that mistakes, or "failures," are okay if they are learned from and not simply repeated. Don't immediately forget the failure, reflect on it, learn from it, and teach others if the opportunity arises.




Sympathy is extended to SDDOT co-workers, family, and friends of Neil Schochenmaier of Pierre.
